As stated in Title 24, Chapter 117, the Regional Commission shall approve municipal plans if it finds that they are consistent with the criteria of Section 4350 and shall provide a determination of energy compliance if it finds that municipal plans are consistent with the criteria of Section 4352 and standards established by the Vermont Department of Public Service.

Pursuant to Title 24, Chapter 117, Sections 4350, NRPC will also consider the planning processes of the Town of Sheldon and Town of Isle La Motte and specifically whether the processes meet the requirements of confirmation as stated in Title 24, Chapter 117.

The public hearing will begin at 6:00pm and hear comments on each town's request in the following order: Sheldon, Isle La Motte, South Hero, Highgate, Montgomery. The Plan Review Committee will meet immediately following the public hearing.
